Outreach and Traffic

Mike and Cate

- January 3rd meeting with DTCI went very well. They have added two new members to the group looking at Waterford: Corinna Sigsbury the DTCI Sr. Transportation Planner Bob Brown, the DTCI's Regional planner and Sr. Project Coordinator to assist with Waterford 2033! There are now a total of 13 members of DTCI and VDOT personnel involved in the coordinated planning for traffic and safety improvements addressed in the update of the Waterford 2003 plan.
- The \$55,000 funding for the Kimley Horn "dust off" will be discussed at the January 4 BOS meeting.
 - Once we have the 2022 version of the 2003 report, we will work on a plan to get the information to Villagers and to design a communications plan that will include interactive and facilitated discussions with interested parties.
- The next phase is for the BOS to determine timing for funding the \$2.3 mil for traffic calming.
 - BOS Committee on Finance, Government and Economic Development will receive the DTCI budget draft on January 20 and the Waterford \$2.3m funding for the engineering of transportation improvements will be listed among the many pending projects.
 - On February 17, the BOS Committee on Finance, Government and Economic Development will finalize their recommendations for the Full Board on the timing of each project (Years 1-6) and the level of funding in each year. We will need to reach out to the Supervisors from mid-February through end of March to secure their support to approve our \$2.3m funding in Year 1 (July 1, 2022)

Sustainability

Mary

- The committee begins 2022 meetings next Monday.
- They are looking at buffer areas surrounding Waterford to assess properties that may be at risk for development. They are considering ways to involve owners and help them understand the easement process and benefits.
- Connie posed a good question about accessibility for disabled visitors, noting the difficulty anyone with mobility issues has getting around the Village. She also noted the lack of public restrooms and water for visitors. Mary noted that the Sustainability Committee would look into that issue as a part of the work stream on adaptive reuse and zoning code updates.

Communications

- Connie Moore has offered to include a 2033 Project Update in the Catoctin Presbyterian Newsletter as we have news to report.
- Mike suggested that a core team meet to update a work stream timeline for use in communicating with Villagers and external partners. We are looking to meet during the 3rd week of January to identify key workstreams, important dates that are already set, timing for various 2033 and other Waterford projects, and other project details that need to be updated or memorialized.

Waterford Foundation Update

- They are working on a budget draft, which will be finalized and approved at the January Waterford Foundation Board meeting. For the first time in many years, they have a surplus.
 - The plan is to use the surplus on long-standing infrastructure projects, such as painting and building repairs.
- They are hiring an expert to survey grant makers and plan to hire a grants writer to develop a template for grant applications and a plan for pursuing appropriate grants.

Additional Updates

Anna Dabney Smith will be joining the Committee. Anna is a long-time Village resident and is studying for her master's in landscape architecture and regional planning. She is also studying sustainability. Her expertise will be a wonderful addition to our work and hopefully the 2033 project can be a subject for her thesis.

Waterford 2033 Sustainability Committee - Meeting Notes Jan. 10, 2022 (Ron, Bo, Matt, Annie, Mike, Mary)

The first meeting of 2022 had an open agenda, with the overarching goal of identifying strategic issues in light of the broader W2033 team strategy session planned for Jan. 14.

Ron outlined early thinking on a SWOT framework for the "what we must do" category of sustainability activities, focusing on the Kimley-Horn (K-H) update and a potential Mill restoration project. On the K-H update, among points he emphasized were: the need to extend the Master Plan to be NHL-wide; noted the opportunity of linking the NHL to Western Loudoun's ("Napa East") rural economy; and emphasized the essential role of walkways/walkability (and parking) to the success of all elements of W2033. On a potential Mill restoration project, among points he flagged were: the opportunity of recreating a Mill Pond for runoff water retention; the potential to recall manufacturing and Quaker history of Waterford; and the need for landscape architect skills across the W2033 effort. His draft write-up was circulated after the meeting; comments from Committee members are welcome.

Annie noted that there has been substantial work done by the WF on open space potential/constraints for individual WF-owned properties, and offered to provide background material. As an example, she shared views on the strategy for use of Phillips Farm, the WF's largest open space property, and how this may be evolving. She also noted the importance of clarity and coordination on communication regarding potential open space projects within W2033. Mike noted that some elements of the charette/community participation process of W2033 may be useful for informing the WF Board, and that there is a regular procedure for sharing of information between the WF Board, WCA Board and W2033 Committee. Committee members expressed appreciation for the sharing of perspectives on open space, and it was agreed that the goal is opportunity for constructive conversations on what is possible.

Bo noted the importance of what is being done through W2033 to integrate the WCA and the WF, and emphasized the role – in the absence of true legal sanctions – of empowering/raising the profile of the NHL through education and outreach. Committee members commented that the draft NHL revision (now being reviewed by the National Park Service) will be a tool for promoting the NHL; and that the NHL revision, along with the W2033 community plan update to the 1987 Waterford Area Management Plan, will be means to enshrine new NHL context into the County's formal planning. Bo also asked about the idea of a micro-finance scheme he had mentioned at an earlier meeting. Committee members expressed strong support, suggesting it be aimed both at adaptive re-use as well as small-scale agriculture; and noted that if successful in Waterford such a project could perhaps be scaled-up to the Loudoun Historic Village Alliance. Bo will return to the Committee with a more fully-scoped micro-credit proposal.

Matt remarked on the potential for broader agriculture uses on some of the WF open space such as the back (west) parcel of Phillips Farm, and the respective values of productively using open space vs. preserving viewshed. On this general topic, several Committee members noted previous outlooks on preservation have seemed to prioritize maintaining historic structures and open spaces for their visual interest (even if empty) while current and evolving preservation best practice appears to prioritize living, functioning spaces within a historical context. Again, the Committee's view was to promote open discussion of potential.

Mike wrapped up the meeting by presenting the template for the strategic update discussion on Jan 14 with members of the larger W2033 Committee. The goal will be to map out next steps for various moving parts of the W2033 effort by phase. The current version of the matrix he shared was circulated to Committee members. Our next Sustainability Committee meeting will take the results of this strategic update as a starting point for orienting our work.

Topics Covered

2022 Zoning Ordinance Review

- Beginning in 2019, the Zoning Ordinance Commission began the process of updating/rewriting all County Zoning Ordinances. Covid has lengthened the timeline for completing this process, but they are now ready for public input. Maura highlighted that our plan and the Ordinance Review must be on parallel paths if we want to protect our interests where zoning is concerned. See the document in the link provided above to review all current zoning ordinances and proposed changes.
- The Loudoun Historic Villages Alliance (LHVA) has already provided input, much of which represents the interests of Waterford and some long-identified issues that need to be resolved. However, it is important that we find the appropriate intersections between our plans and the Zoning Ordinance Review. We have three avenues for giving input: Maura is our representative on the Zoning Ordinance Commission and will share our input, we can provide input directly as the 2033 Organizing Committee (jointly with the WCA and WFI,) and we can each provide input as individual citizens. She notes that we should pursue all three avenues.
 - o Maura notes that none of the LHVA feedback has yet been incorporated.
 - We need to make certain to reinforce their comments and add our own feedback based on changes needed to accommodate the KH plan and our plans for adaptive reuse, sustainability, and open land use, among others.
- The Small Area Plans will be done in 2023.
- The primary topics covered by the zoning ordinances include the following: use matrix, parking, performance standards, overlay districts, zoning districts, development standards, signs, and historic districts.

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Committee Updates:

Outreach and Traffic

- The visioning meeting scheduled for Friday, January 14 will now be virtual due to the high incidence of Covid. We will plan for a two-stage process in which we will brainstorm virtually in this first session and then regroup in person in February for a more fulsome session.
- Cate has created an initial framework for tracking project progress and memorializing important dates. She will be updating to an Excel format for ease of use. We will continue to look for the best means to track progress until we get a Project Manager.

Water

• The water study is now likely due in February.

Sustainability

- The Committee met on January 10.
- Ron did a SWOT analysis on the KH Report.
 - The group determined that we need to think about a National Historic Landmarkwide approach to planning for open space, rather than limiting it to the village open spaces.
 - They hope to communicate what is special about the whole NHL area as a part of their planning, with a focus on shifting from pure "traditional" preservation to new ways of thinking about usability and livability for Villagers.
- The Committee has formed a strong partnership with the Waterford Foundation • Committees on the Phillips Farm and Preservation.

- A future article is planned to highlight the BOS approval of the funds for the KH Dust Off.

and we need to consider that in the process. We need to remind people of the sense of community that made Waterford what it is.

Part of sustainability is financial stability for the WFI. This needs to be considered in all planning.

Need to create a list of all things that we have planned. We have a short window to determine what is possible given issues related to the rezoning process. Mary volunteered the Sustainability Committee to work on the zoning issues overview, considering work already done and what the WFI needs to pursue its strategic plan.

Three elements of the plan (as suggested by Bo):

- What do we have to do?
- What can be done?
- Choose one breakthrough project that tests our core concepts

Waterford 2033 -- Tasks for 2022 With Sustainability Links

Some Proposed Teams, Timing, Goals, Inter-linkages

1. **County zoning** troubleshooting and follow up particularly on open space and adaptive reuse **[Q1 task]** – Mary, Annie, Michelle, Emily – aim in short term for input via Maura, Charlie to ZOC; and to County via higher level efforts -- longer term (1) evolve into an **adaptive reuse** review (linked or combined with **economic sustainability** review, below) for WF and non-WF properties; and (2) provide input to addressing the NPS and other historic standards via consultant work.

2. **K-H Master Plan** and sustainability links – Mike, Sharyn, Ron, Matt, Mary **[Q1** *task]* – aim to ensure key sustainability elements, e.g., integrating full NHL, walkability, landscape considerations of infrastructure, identifying open space and adaptive reuse obstacles to address via **zoning review** (above), etc.

3. NHL **Open Space Plan** (WF and non-WF properties) – Annie, Ron, Anna, Bo, Mimi [Q1-4] – short term aim to launch collaboration on WF properties with WF, initiate plans for Phillips Farm native plant/invasives management; longer term develop plans for other sustainable PF management (linked to **Municipal Services** and **K-H Master Plan**, particularly on stormwater runoff and drainage), as well as plans for other WF and non-WF properties.

4. **Mill Restoration** adaptive reuse pilot project – Ron, Stephanie T, Bo, others tbd [Q1-4, longer term] – aim in near term to define pilot project and ensure integration with **K-H Master Plan**, develop micro-finance pilot, plan longer term Mill and Phillips Farm project (in synch with **Open Space** plan).

5. **Renewable energy** pilot – Ron, Matt, Stephanie T [Q1-4] – in near term identify key issues for **K-H Master Plan**(e.g., Dominion interconnection issues), zoning and historic restrictions (and whether County, State or NPS) that could modified; and whether this should be integrated with **Mill restoration pilot** (above); medium term define what may be possible with private suppliers and easements.

6. **Municipal services** review – Mike, Sharyn, Ron, Matt, Mary **[Q1-2 task]** – in near term aim to identify and feed into (formalizes as part of?) the **K-H Master Plan** provision for a minimum set of "public good" municipal services Waterford should plan for (including responsibilities for maintenance): drainage and run-off management (link to **Open Space Plan**), trash collection, water and sewerage, walkability, street landscaping lights and signs; follow up on that work to ensure - who is responsible institutionally, financially to ensure provision for service/maintenance.

7. **Economic sustainability** review – Ron, Annie, Emily, Bo, Mary others [Q1-4] – based on appropriate historic village comparators, assess appropriate tourism and investment potential, based on tourism forecasts, adaptive reuse potential, including micro-finance pilot, possibility to bring sustainability to the Waterford Fair; perhaps combine this with broader **adaptive reuse** strategy?

8. **NHL buffer** issues (inventory border/outside NHL open space/conservation easement potential of current agricultural properties, traffic, etc.) – Christy, Bo, Mary, Emily, others tbd [Q1-4] a longer-term task, aim to identify NHL buffer issues and develop strategy for addressing, including through LCPCC and LHVA

 <u>ACTION Step:</u> Mike recommended we ask DTCI and KH to work with us to leverage Dominion Funds with other funding sources.
- VDHR and US Dept of Interior Executives are working to schedule a site visit as soon as can be coordinated.

Traffic/ Kimley Horn Updates to our 2003 Plan

Sh<u>aryn</u>

- Meeting with Kimley Horn set for February 2nd at 1pm
- Mike will reach out to JT to learn when the KH contract will be signed
- Speed cameras and decibel monitoring devices were discussed. Christy said she will reach out to Rucci to determine which speed camera she has; Anna and Cate offered to have them mounted on their homes to ensure all points of entry are recorded. Mat offered to have a decibel monitor and speed camera on his home.
- Mike will reach out to JT to determine if the County can begin providing the Traffic Committee with the data collected from their three entry-free standing speed capture devices.
- Mike also reminded all that the WCA has an air-quality monitor on the Corner Store and that it registers far above appropriate. Mary then provided the following Analysis:

1. Air quality: EPA annual PM2.5 health protective level is 12 ug/m3 and 24-hour is 35

ug/m3. She shared the "PurpleAir" map of Waterford reported our 24-hour reading stayed > 50 over the EPA health level. She suggested it might be good to have a nearby control device outside the village for comparison and offered to allow one to be installed at her home, though that location would be affected by road-dust.

Mary also looked at "FireAirNow" (combines large public sensors and PurpleAir sensors to smooth curve). (Photo below). Our graph looks roughly like Hamilton and the outskirts of Purcellville where other PurpleAir sensors are -- and unlike the few countryside sensors. A sign that we're a village and have too much traffic, we should not look like Hamilton, Purcellville, or DC for that matter.

2. Noise: Mary reported that the EPA standard is complex, outdated and difficult to interpret but 70 db is overall health protective level, with 55 db outdoors and 45 indoors comfort levels. Suggestion was to look into devices to monitor traffic decibels -- we could compare with these levels for a first indication.

- Mike reported that Scott Finchem is on track to deliver the draft study for the Traffic Committee to review next month.
- Mike is engaged with the VA Department of Health to identify potential funding sources directed to the State through the recently past National Infrastructure legislation.

- Mary prompted a discussion on how the KH Study will interface with new Sustainability initiatives. In addition to drainage/run-off uses and walkability, what else can we expect to have integrated in the final KH 2033 pan? Cate indicated that at a minimum, we should insist we have placeholders for all considered initiatives and, if possible detailed plans for our Phase I plans.
- ACTION: We need to fold the Sustainability Committee's Tasks Matrix into the Master 2033 Matrix. Both are attached.
- Patti pointed out the Catoctin Creek is a State Designated Scenic River, up until it enters Phillips Farm and that we might want to consider extending the designation through the Farm
- Cate reported that the Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant cycle has opened and those funds could serve the Phillips Farm goals.
- With respect to the ongoing input into the County Zoning Ordinance updates: Mary or Christy will ask Karl Riedel whether the Historic District Review Committee has been asked for their input.

She also noted that they agree that their parking area may be used for Waterford Foundation events. The church is also willing to put in a traffic cam.

Traffic/ Kimley Horn Updates to our 2003 Plan

- Nothing new on traffic
- Connie noted that the traffic noise is ear-splitting on Sunday mornings and others noted it is like that every day. We discussed whether there are any noise regulations for mufflers.
- Maura Walsh Copeland was at the open house and discussed the limitations of zoning on so many of the innovations we are considering.
 - ACTION ITEM: Plan a meeting with Maura, Cate, Chris, Stephanie to discuss how to encourage the County to look at the rural village issues earlier than they have planned.
- One question raised at the open house is whether we are still considering the idea of a bypass.

Water

- Still waiting on the water study.
- The water-focused portion of the panel discussion on water and traffic was very well received. In contrast with previous conversations with villagers about water, the mood was overall positive and people are open to learning. Showing the water table map was helpful and contrasting the number of wells in Waterford vs. typical well concentration on farms helped people see the issue more clearly.

<u>Sustainability</u>

- Van Sweden has been in touch and will set up a time to visit to discuss landscaping.
- The solar panel display was well received and people want more information. We discussed that there appear to be no restrictions to adding these types of panels to roofs.
- It was decided that we should follow up the open house with a Saturday workshop in which we teach people to make rain barrels out of wine barrels, discuss the solar options in more depth, and look at the potential of contracting with one trash company for the whole village who will recycle.
 - ACTION ITEM: Sustainability committee members to plan the workshop for a weekend in April.

Communications

- The open house was a huge success and kudos to all who worked to help make it an excellent means of communicating the work of this committee.
 - There was distinct consistency with the thoughts expressed in the straw poll in 2021, which tells us we are on the right track.
 - We could have done a better job of letting people know that the KH boards were from 2003. Some people thought they represented current decisions that have been made.
 - We discussed the fact that many villagers have made an incorrect assumption that Waterford was always a sleepy town. In fact, it was a bustling commercial center for the majority of years it has been in existence. Many businesses were still here when the 1987 study was done, including a hardware, gas station, and barber in addition to the Market.

Cate

- Weekly DTCI and VDOT meeting was productive because we were able to tell them that we got the funds approved. They were surprised but got on board. One member had been a part of the 2003 study, which helped to turn their attitudes around.
- KH reports that they will have a completed report by April 18 which they will then send to the county. On the 19th they will send it to us.
 - Mike noted that we need to get a grid of any changes the county makes to the recommendations.
- The KH presentation and charette is April 27 at 7 pm at the Old School.

Traffic

- Sharon will receive new data from the speed monitors this week.
- She is also getting names of the people willing to have cameras installed.
- After the last BOS meeting where we discussed average speeds, the Sherriff has made more visits. We understand that they apprehended many speeders going over 40 mph and at least one going 60.

Water

- Still waiting on the water study.
- Mike is working on framing the communications strategy and methodology so that we get information from the study out to the people quickly, but also in a manner that will help them understand it. Several points are critical to understanding:
 - Residential zoning here allows for 1 well for 3 acres that would typically serve one family. However, Waterford has 55 wells in a 3 acre area
 - That was not a major issue when everyone had smaller, shallower hand-dug wells. As the water table was depleted, machine-dug wells were necessary. It was at this point that issues began to present due to the geological makeup of the village, proximity of neighbors and competing wells, and issues with water quality.
 - There are water studies from the 1960's to present that chronicle the degradation of the potable water situation.

Mike

- The village has rejected common water sources in the past because they believed wells were cheaper and some prefer well water. However, well maintenance in an area that is challenged is expensive.
- Another common concern is abandoning their wells. They would not have to do that, though they would need a bifurcated system.
- The only costs to homeowners would be the cost of linkage from the street to the house.
- No Water tower is planned.

- Ron took Carl, a Phillips Farm Committee member, on a tour of Blandy, Millwood, and Aldie.
 At Millwood, they learned that there is a Society for the Preservation of Old Mills.

Cate congratulated Susan Manch on her new position as Board President of the Waterford Foundation, Inc, thanked her for her remarkable service as Chair of our Communications Committee and welcomed Jane Williams as our new Communications Chair.

Committee Updates:

Outreach- Cate Magennis Wyatt

- Cate, Stephanie and Mike are working with US Rep. Jennifer Wexton office with the hope of securing earmark funding for Waterford. The request is due this Friday and would then proceed to the US Congressional Appropriations Committee. Waterford's application will use the completed Water Study that provides detailed cost estimates that can be referenced.
- Mike Stup emphasized community support for Waterford's Water Study. Cate pointed out the success of various federal and state agencies for funding the Hillsboro Comprehensive Plan. She also said that the water needs of Waterford Elementary school will be included in the earmark.

• Waterford 2033 Consultant's Presentation will be held on April 27, 2022. Rep. Wexton's Outreach Director, Tami Davis, and Regional Director for US Senator Tim Kaine, Rachel Reibach, will be attending this event. Copies of the chronology of Waterford 2033 and the matrix of Waterford's water studies done over the years will be available along with an update on the 2003 Plan lead by Kimley Horn.

Traffic – Sharyn Franck

- A steady stream of information is being gathered by the speed monitors. The highest speeds have been record so far on Clark's Gap. Speed increases with nightfall sometimes reaching 44 to 55 miles per hour.
- Sharyn attended the Transportation Hearing which discussed the modifications of Route 7 and Route 287 exits. This may affect Waterford.

Water – Mike Stup

- The Water Study is posted on the WCA website.
- Loudon Water is producing a video for Waterford citizens, the two churches, Loudon Mutual Insurance Company and Waterford Elementary which will explain the water issues and options facing the town.
- Mike emphasized the need to build consensus around water issues. The current survey show almost 70% support from citizens for exploring water solutions. One option would include a four-year \$10.5 million plan and design for county water. There will be no water tower and citizens would not have to participate if they choose to keep using their individual well. There would be individual water meters that would be optional.
- Mike pointed out the hand-dug wells are no longer encouraged by the county due to a very high propensity for water contamination by E.coli and other forms of bacteria in well water.

• Anna suggested bundling the water and traffic issues. Cate thanked her and shared that that is precisely what we are doing and the economy of scales will save the effort millions of dollars.

Sustainability – Ron Benschoter

- He has created a Master Action list for all initiatives to allow us to track each and will be reviewing it with Mary Sheehan in the coming days. Ongoing work on adaptive use of the Mill and actions plans continue.
- WCA Survey on citizens using rain barrels and composting went out April 25. This may lead to a workshop at the end of May.
- Cate and Ron are speaking with Solarize Virginia.

<u>Waterford Foundation – Stephanie Thompson</u>

- The Trail Run on April 23 was a success. There were 350 participants up from 240 from last year.
- Waterford Foundation elected new officers to its board at its annual meeting on April 19.

Other Business

- Cate mentioned Tim McGinn is willing to update his survey of all Waterford Foundation buildings and create a master list which will outline what repairs/costs are necessary to bring each u to "Office" level occupancy. None will be, per se offices, but for code purposes this is the level sought.
- Anna stated that we should consider an artist-in-residency program. Ron said this is still on the sustainability agenda and that he can me with her to develop a plan.
- It was noted that on April 24 at the Old School an exhibit featuring the paintings of Waterford by Garnet Jex from the 1940s was held. The

Washington Society for Landscape Painters also attended the exhibit after a morning of painting various scenes in Waterford.







Considerations for Waterford

Some upsides:

- Overall: new zoning rewrite enhances attention for to County Rural Historic Villages
- Embeds new **historic village** planning tool through VCOD, community plan
- New zoning districts do not substantially change old districts
- Broad range of allowed uses
- Special and minor special exceptions continue to be possible via the BOS
- Exceptions may be the best path for large adaptive reuse projects like the Mill

Some challenges:

 "Compatible" uses – how to achieve 2019 Comp Plan promise? Flexibility for villages, Rural historic commercial zoning?





- We in Waterford are concerned mainly with two sections:
 - VCOD and community plans, and
 - Adaptive Reuse
- Consulted with County administration on possible one-off zoning changes through two channels and have received the following messages:
 - One-off zoning changes are not envisaged
 - The new Adaptive Reuse language is designed to allow historic buildings to be (re)used for most purposes including commercial, regardless of their actual zoning designation
 - The community plan framework is not yet being formally developed by County staff; but when it is, parcel-by-parcel zoning changes will be considered, and the

resulting plan will be incorporated into the ZOR (like Waterford's Area Management Plan of 1987 was)

- Other partner organizations are also reviewing these two ZOR sections (Loudoun Coalition and its member organizations, other villages, LHVA, Heritage Commission, HDRC, etc.)
- In terms of comments to County, important that we have a core set of shared messages with our Western Loudoun/village-focused partners
- Two such overall messages are:
 - 1. We encourage the County to prioritize development of the community plan framework as soon as feasible (particularly for villages that are ready to work on their plans)
 - 2. We encourage the County to consider more flexibility in the Adaptive Reuse language which currently implies burdensome and costly consultant services and other requirements (e.g., parking) villages may have a hard time carrying out
- Waterford 2033 will also have its own specific issues to add to the feedback and to our own thinking about an eventual more formal community plan
- One key way we will identify feedback is through a "stress test" case study of Adaptive Reuse in the Mill (that Ron, Mary, WFI colleagues are working on) which will try to estimate cost and difficulties of current language

We should also be gathering the potential list of uses for other WFI historic buildings we'd like to see adaptively reused to ensure these uses are foreseen

- The NHL Update may provide some avenues for new zoning-related thinking (e.g., viewshed, open space, protective districts)
- At the WFI Board meeting Board member Forrest Hayes (Planning Commission Chair) noted that he would like the PC to have an education session on village issues and he will inform how that session could be organized
 - We should be prepared to participate in this session when information available, and the Mill stress-test may be informative for this
- Finally, W2033 may be best served by continuing to work with the current Waterford zoning and outside the formal community plan framework, and thus then be ready and able to updating any zoning as needed once that framework is available
